**COFFEE KIDS GETS MAJOR MEDIA PUSH FROM MACHINE HERO
AT 2008 SPECIALTY COFFEE CONFERENCE**

(Minneapolis, Minn.) - Over 7,300 people from 72 countries flocked to Minneapolis, Minn. for the 20th Annual Specialty Coffee Association of America (SCAA) Convention and Exhibition May 3-6. The opening address included a short film honoring the 20th anniversary of Coffee Kids, a non-profit dedicated to helping coffee-farming families improve the quality of their lives.

"The film is a great success for Coffee Kids. It not only tells our story and history, but looks ahead to the next twenty years," said Bill Fishbein, founder of the Santa Fe, N.M.-based non-profit.

The ten-minute film was produced by Providence, Rhode Island-based, Machine Hero, LLC – a communication arts company that uses film and other tools to help clients explore, design and express unique, powerful, innovative messages. Machine Hero donated half of the project budget in goods and services for the film.

"Machine Hero did an excellent job of capturing the nuances of our mission and communicating what makes us unique," said Carolyn Fairman, executive director of Coffee Kids. "We're extremely grateful for their support."

The film was photographed and co-directed by Joshua Backer, creative director and co-founder of Machine Hero. Backer is known for his documentary style and unique approach to on-camera interviews.

"The individuals we interviewed for this film are outstanding advocates for coffee-farming families," said Joshua Backer. "But more importantly, they speak to the need for fair treatment of human beings around the world and how support for organizations like Coffee Kids makes a concrete difference."
